## Plans Religious War Unless British Leave

CAIRO, Egypt, April 24.—(UP)—Egypt's Premier Gen. Mohammed Naguib said last night his nation is ready to proclaim a "jihad" (religious war or crusade) unless British Forces leave the Suez Canal zone.

"We will proclaim jihad if necessary for the sake of freedom and independence", Naguib said in an address to military trainees. "It is the duty of all citizens, regardless of age and sex, to be ready to sacrifice."
